

BENCHMARK STANDARDS - METHODOLOGY IN QUESTIONNAIRE 2

STANDARD 1: P&P Services should be using a tool/methodology to detect and assess radicalized inmates

STANDARD 2: Risk assessment tool/risk assessment methodology should identify specific goals (1. Detect radicalized inmates/probationers, 2. Assess the level of radicalization of inmates/probationers, 3. Monitor the level of radicalization and dangerousness of inmates/probationers), 4. Other

STANDARD 3: In case of potential radicalization, the risk assessment should go through a two-step procedure

STANDARD 4: Evaluation of radicalization should be reliable. The tool should take into consideration the different factors (root causes) and processes of radicalization. The risk assessment tool/methodology should have a holistic approach of the inmate/probationer.

STANDARD 5: The information collected to implement radicalization risk assessment should come from a variety of sources

STANDARD 6: continuous cycles of risk assessment avoid labelling and allow to make decisions according to accurate information

STANDARD 7: Human resources. 1. Invest In, Develop and Offer General Awareness Training to All P and P Staff, 2. Risk Assessment team with a strong academic background and a relevant professional experience. 3. Multidisciplinary Risk Assessment Team.

STANDARD 8: Practitioners carrying out risk assessment should be supported by peers and management

STANDARD 9: The risk assessment tool/methodology should be evaluated through objective criteria

The methodology considers the benchmark standards and **scores the answers** provided by RASMORAD country partners.

Five levels of implementation of the risk assessment have been identified for each standard. Each level has been assigned with a **specific score**, from “*Standard not implemented at all*” to *Standard fully implemented*”.

THE ANALYSIS: the analysis of the data will allow to identify promising practices. Promising practices may be identified in all level of implementation. By scoring answers provided by country partners, the analysis may identify gaps and/or overlaps in the processes implemented by the different prison and probation services.

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
